Police report

Previous priorities: ASB around Ashmead House and Croydon House (police met young people and signed agreements with families), cycling on pavements, drug dealing and parking problems

Issues raised:

- Serious incident at Lidl
- Increase in criminal damage to vehicles on Avonvale Road: resident concern that this was racist incident targeting cars owned by Somali residents however other residents at the meeting confirmed they had also experienced problems.

8 June – police in Newtown Park security tagging bikes

Minor Traffic Schemes

£25,000 for Ashley, Easton and Lawrence Hill for small traffic management schemes proposed by residents. Limits to what BCC can do with £25k but there is the opportunity to use some Section 106 (planning) money to supplement this. Residents raised some other schemes: access on Mary Street, crossing on Avonvale Road by Netham Park, blanket parking restriction, Beam Street parking restrictions. Vote was taken and scheme to be taken forward: pedestrian crossing on Avonvale Road.

Waste Management Report

Communal bins in St Pauls area were a success – now transferring the scheme to Easton. Recycling has gone up in St Pauls as a result of bins.

Sovereign Housing Association

Moving on site of old Winstanley House (26 new homes to be completed by May 2011) to include public art. Avonvale Road shops demolished July 2011 (21 new homes to be completed by August 2011). Nine listening posts installed (audio story telling) over next year. Also working with residents to secure funds to landscape 'Crypt Square' outside St Luke's Church.

Barton Hill Settlement

Joanna Holmes updated on plans to redevelop old Farmhouse Building into meeting rooms and office space for hire. Community hall will be redeveloped into conference centre and The Dug Out into leisure facility. Will take several years to complete whole plan and aim is to be more financially self sufficient.

Sikh Resource Centre

Bought old Barton Hill Primary School on Queen Ann Road to turn into community centre for Sikh community. Building is a lot bigger than they need so will be opening it up to other organisations. Hope to open in July.
